**Congratulations to CASA's 15 newest volunteer Guardians ad Litem** (GALs) who completed their training last week! This brings the number of active GALs advocating for children who have been abused and neglected to 252. CASA volunteers expect to serve 800 children suffering severe abuse and neglect this year.

In the first four months of 2023, volunteer GALs have worked with 517 abused and neglected children in Franklin County – providing a strong voice and advocating for the children they serve. However, there are children waiting to be assigned their GAL.

As we near the end of National Foster Care Month, we share the following from the <u>American Academy of Pediatrics</u>:

Mental and behavioral health is the largest unmet health need for children and teens in foster care. Mental and behavioral health requires the presence of at least 1 nurturing, responsive caregiver who is stable in the child's or teen's life over time.
